AN UPDATE FROM THE PRESIDENT!

We're working on it... here's an update!

- We are close to executing the Board's decision concerning the future location of the synagogue.
- Our architects, Brawer Hauptman, are anxious to start the process for the design of our new home that will involve the entire Congregation.
- In the interim, we have entered into a one-year renewable lease with the Federation for the use of space at the JCC.
- We hope there will be a final settlement with our insurance company by the end of the month. The amounts we have received from the insurance company thus far are being invested on an interim basis.

Because many of these issues are being resolved on a time-sensitive and confidential basis, I look forward to sending updates with more information as we continue through the process.

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

A Message from the Rabbi and President

Since the fire, much of the energy of our Chisuk Emuna leadership has been devoted to envisioning our future physical home. As important as considering *where* we are going to be, is focusing on *what* we are going to be? Chisuk Emuna needs both a physical home and a robust and compelling spiritual life to engage members of our congregation and community in deepening their relationships with G-d, each other and the world through prayer, study and *gemilut hasadim*, acts of loving kindness.

Building a new building will give us the exhilarating opportunity to manifest our Jewish values in a physical space. Our respect for all people will be manifested in a building that is accessible to all. Our belief in our responsibility to preserve the earth will be reflected in the "green-friendly" building we construct. The warm, welcoming and participatory nature of our congregation will be represented in a sanctuary where those gathered in prayer and Torah study will sit in semi-circles. These are just three examples of how our physical space will reflect our values.

Our congregation's spiritual life must also reflect the Jewish values we hold dear. Our respect for all people is manifested in ensuring *bnai mitzvah* celebrations for children of all abilities. Our value of being a *heimishe* and supportive congregation is reflected in our gathering *minyanim* for those reciting *kaddish*. The warm, welcoming and participatory nature of our congregation is reflected in the variety of services and programs held on Shabbat mornings and the involvement of members

of our congregation in leading services, reading Torah and sharing *divrei Torah*. These are just three examples of how our spiritual life reflects our values.

As we consider our congregation's future, we can and must do more to increase the participation of members and others in prayer and study and Jewish practice. Now that our Board of Directors has made a decision about our preferred location, it is time to establish the Spiritual Life Taskforce that we announced several weeks ago.

Twelve people of different ages and backgrounds are being asked to serve on this taskforce. Chaired by Maggie Grotzinger, the Spiritual Life Taskforce is charged with the responsibility of exploring Chisuk Emuna's spiritual life with the goal of increasing the active participation of members and others in diverse offerings of services, classes, and experiences for individuals, families and groups.

With the work of this taskforce and the input of other members of our congregation, we are confident that we can take concrete steps to move forward in enhancing our spiritual life as we simultaneously move forward with building our physical space.

Join your Chisuk Emuna family for Purim, one of the most joyous holidays on the Jewish calendar.

Join us for the **Reading of the Megilla** on **Saturday, February 27th** at **7:15 PM** Purim night is one of the most popular and joyful services of the year. Join us in costume or not as we listen to the *Megillah*, shake our *graggers* to the name of Haman, play games at Sports City and eat Hamantashen.

Purim is celebrated on the 14th day of *Adar*. The 13th of *Adar* is the day that Haman chose for the extermination of the Jews, and the day that the Jews battled their enemies for their lives. On the day afterwards, the 14th, Jews celebrated their survival. In cities that were walled in the time of Joshua, Purim is celebrated on the 15th of the month. In Shushan (a walled city), deliverance from the massacre was not complete until the next day. The 15th is referred to as *Shushan Purim*.

The word "*Purim*" means "lots" and refers to the lottery that Haman used to choose the date for the massacre. The Purim holiday is preceded by the **Fast of Esther**, which commemorates Esther's three days of fasting in preparation for her meeting with the king. In years — like this one — when Purim

falls on *motzei Shabbos*, the Fast of Esther is observed on the Thursday before Purim. This year, it falls on **February 25th**.

There are four important mitzvahs to be observed for Purim; some of them can be observed with the help of your Chisuk Emuna family.

1. **Megilla** - Each year, we are required to listen to the complete reading of *Megillat Esther*. Please join us as the *Megilla* is read on **Saturday, February 27th** at **7:15 PM** and during Purim morning services on **Sunday, February 28th** at **8:30 AM**.

2. **Mishloach Manot** - *Mishloach Manot* is the fun Mitzvah of sharing food with friends and neighbors, giving at least two types of food to at least two recipients. The mitzvah of *mishloach manot* is based on the verse in the *Megillah* instructing us to "send portions one to another" (9:22). You can send *Mishloach Manot* through USY.

3. **Matanot L'evyonim** - Based on the injunction in the *Megillah* that on Purim we must "send gifts to the poor" (9:22), the holiday affords us a special opportunity to share our good fortune with those in need. Maimonides writes in his *Mishneh Torah (Hilkhos Megillah 2:17)*: "It is better for a person to increase

gifts to the poor than to increase his feast or the *mishloach manot* to his neighbors. There is no joy greater or more rewarding than to gladden the heart of the poor, orphans, widows, and strangers. For by gladdening the hearts of the downtrodden, we are following the example of the Divine." There will be an opportunity to give a few dollars to charities that help the poor at the end of the *Megillah* reading.

4. **Seudat Purim** - It is a mitzvah to have a feast with our family on the day of Purim.

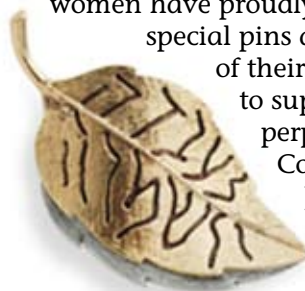
